Expression of Interest – General Practitioner Representative

Expressions of Interest are invited for membership of the Queensland Rehabilitation Clinical Network (QRbCN), Community Rehabilitation Special Interest Group (CR SIG). Membership is for a period up to 2 years and commences February 2024.

Meetings for the CR SIG Executive will be monthly (except no meetings on school holidays) via MS Teams. Please see meeting schedule attached.

The aim is for the CR SIG Executive to be a representative group of health professionals to:

- provide leadership and clinical expertise to drive system-wide best practice in community rehabilitation
- develop a community rehabilitation strategy or statement of minimum requirements
- discuss funding opportunities for community rehabilitation
- share/support/ promote innovative community rehabilitation models of the implementation and replication of best practice approaches across community rehabilitation
- optimise community rehabilitation data collection
- share clinical challenges, expertise, knowledge, successes and failures
- develop statewide resources for community rehabilitation as required
- collaborate and coordinate statewide evaluation strategies, education and research opportunities in community rehabilitation
- advocate for and promote community rehabilitation services in Queensland
- provide advice on community rehabilitation to the Qld Rehabilitation Clinical Network as required.

Membership consists of medical, nursing, allied health, community health, general practice, indigenous, consumer and non-government organisations from across Queensland.

Role of the GP representative

The role of the GP representative is to:

- Actively participate in discussions and meetings
- Confidently advocate on behalf of GPs
- Bring a GP perspective to all discussions and decision-making
- Review meeting papers in advance and respond to out of session business via email as required
- Promote the activities and resources of the network and provide linkages with other potential strategic partners
- Identify future opportunities and improvements in relation to the network
